## From Principal Tim Gering:

## Here is a note from the Counseling Department:

Students have the opportunity to take college courses during his/her high school career. The advanced opportunity program will allow students as early as 7<sup>th</sup> grade to begin taking high school courses to expedite the completion of the graduation requirements and possibly complete an associate's degree by the end of his/her high school years with the state of Idaho paying for the courses. The other program beyond the early completer is the fast forward program that pays for a 3 credit college class for juniors and 6 credits for seniors. Students taking college courses also have an advantage of living in Boundary County and can receive a discount off the tuition for the junior colleges in Idaho.
